

Dr. Middleton Returns.

Dr. Middleton returned from his trip through Kane and Garfield counties the fore part of this week and reports a pleasant out. He says that there was none of the fog that has prevailed here on the other side of the range. The weather there was clear the whole of the time. The child of Mr. Little at Kanab, whom the doctor expected to operate on for appendicitis, was found to be in a condition that did not seem to warrant the operation, so was let go over for the present, at least. All the way up the line from Kanab to Panguitch the news was phoned ahead that Dr. Middleton was on the road and patients besieged him most of the way. At Panguitch five major operations were performed, and the patients left in charge of Dr. Clark, the local practicing physician.

On the trip the doctor met with a number of the prominent men of that section of the country and talked up the matter of increasing the capital stock of the Bank of Southern Utah from \$25,000 to \$40,000. The proposition was favorably received, and a number of the influential people agreed to subscribe for the additional stock.

At Kanab the doctor reports the people are taking considerable interest in the exhuming of relics from the mounds that are very abundant thereabouts. Many good specimens of pottery ware and other articles have been unearthed.

Kanab, the doctor says, is about the warmest-hearted little community he was ever in. He was treated royally and will be glad to visit the place again when occasion requires.
