

ANOTHER FLOOD

TUESDAY EVENING.

Another large body of water came down Coal Creek late Tuesday afternoon, doing a great deal of damage to roads and fields.

The flood was as large or larger than the one that came down the canyon two weeks ago Saturday, spreading over more country and inundating more fields. When it reached the mouth of the canyon it overflowed the banks of the creek bed and the water ran east thru the field around the Indian village, leaving the Indians marooned on an island with water two or three feet deep all around them. They mounted horses and carrying their belongings rode to the hills east of the village and waited for the flood to subside, when they moved back again.

At the northern end of town the water spread over the residence part flooding gardens, corrals and filling a few cellars.

After passing the town the flood found its way to the Bull Dog field and spread over practically the entire field, making it a lake in places two or three feet deep.

The road up the Cedar canyon is reported to be further damaged by the large volume of water that passed down the canyon. The temporary bridge at the north end of Main street on the Arrowhead trail, which was erected to take the place of the old structure that was washed away two weeks ago, withstood the flood and the Arrowhead trail is open for travel as before.
