

Cedar Men Return After "Running" San Juan, Colorado

Elwood Corry, Cedar Stake President, and Gustive O. Larson, director of the Cedar City L D S Institute of Religion, returned Sunday from a most interesting experience, running the Colorado river from Mexican Hat in Utah to Lee's Ferry in Arizona.

They made the trip with a 20-man party in four boats, and ran all of the rapids in the San Juan except one over which they "Lined" the boats with ropes.

The party entered the river above the famous Goose Necks of the San Juan, stopped at Aztec Canyon to visit the famous Rainbow Bridge, and at the "Crossing of the Fathers" to visit the steps cut into the rocks

above Padre creek. The trip took from May 23 to June 1.

Pres. Corry and Mr. Larson report that the water is high in both rivers, and that the San Juan offers a real thrill to river runners.
