## Cedar City pilots enjoy color country fly-in trip

A full day of flight over areas of southern Utah and northern Arizona was enjoyed by 27 residents of the area Monday in a fly-in organized and directed by Jim Breeze, Airport manager and Bob Sigfrid

Seven single engine planes operated by Cedar Flying Service and privately owned aircraft participated in the day-long activities. Piloting the 27 members of the party were Breeze, Sigfried, Dex Cowley,

Bob Bradshaw, Dan Robinson, John Cox, Douglas Knell, all of Cedar City and Leon Snow of St. George.

The party of seven aircraft left Cedar City at approximately 8 a.m. Monday and returned that evening near 6 p.m. In between the group

touched down at Bull Frog Basin on Lake Powell, at Olito, an old trading post, at Kayenta, Marble Canyon and finally at Pipe Springs, before returning home.

The flight took the party

over a wide expanse of beautiful country and into remote areas that are seldom visited by the normal tourist groups.

Flights took the party over Hole in the Rock, Rainbow Bridge, Monument Valley, Navajo Mountain, Page and Glen Canyon Dam.
