

## DEER DO DAMAGE IN KAIBAB ...FORES; REMEDY IS SOUGHT.

To seek a remedy for forest destruction caused by 25,000 deer in the national game refuge known as Kaibab national forest in northern Arizona, Governor. Hunt and other state officials will leave here today in automobiles on a trip that will necessitate travel through parts of Utah and Nevada and will carry them to the north rim of the Grand Canyon.

The region to be visited by the party is known as the "Arizona strip," a wilderness almost as large as the state of New York and containing only two postoffices, one at Fredonia and the other at Wolf Hole.

Deer in the Kaibab forest are increasing at the rate of 8000 a year, it is estimated by game officials here, and are rapidly destroying the undergrowth in the forest.

Among the officials who will make the trip are R. H. Rutledge, district forester, of Ogden, Utah, and S. P. Locke, forestry expert, of Ogden.
