In the Kanab game the Cedar players rushed into a 12 to 4 lead in the first quarter, but saw that lead gradually dwindle until the visitors tied the score at 26 all. At this point the Cedarites rallied to pull away, and although Kanab put up a game fight they could not keep up with the fast traveling Cedar squad.

The entire Cedar five, Bob Lunt and Kent Dover, forwards; Reed Rosenberg, center; Clyde Lowman and Dorian Janson, guards; played excellent ball throughout, with Boo leading the attack, playing a sensational floor game and hitting the hoop from all angles for a total of 21 points. Johnson was the outstanding player for Kanab, with Chamberlain and Cram crowding him closely.

The Cedar - Dixie game was almost a repetition of the Kanab encounter, with Cedar rushing into the lead, losing that advantage and then coming back to pull the game out of the fire. Cedar took a 9 to 1 lead in the first period, but went to pieces in the second quarter, passing and shooting wildly, and when the half period ended Dixie was leading 14 to 13. In the third period Kent Dover literally went wild, rustling the ball sensationally, showing an uncanny knack of slipping behind his guard for setups, shots that it seemed he just could not miss, and by the time the period had ended he had dropped in seven field goals and his team was in the lead 27 to 20. He was closely covered in the final canto by Bob Lunt, Mooch Lowman and Court Nelson, substituting for Rosenberg, scored field goals and Dixie never
