

Cedar City Nurse Gets Medal For Outstanding Work

Word was received in Cedar City yesterday afternoon, via the radio station KSL 5:45 news broadcast, that Miss Elizabeth Jones, who is now working in the Mount Zion hospital in San Francisco, California, had been presented with the Rosenstirn medal for outstanding work in her chosen field. It is a distinct honor to receive the Rosenstirn medal, which is awarded annually to the graduate nurse of the Mount Zion hospital who has done the most outstanding work during her three years of training and the first year following graduation, and Miss Jones was chosen from a class of approximately 35 students.

Miss Jones was born in Cedar City, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. K. L. Jones, and received her early education here. She was a graduate of the high school division of the Branch Agricultural College and attended the college division for one year, after which she went to San Francisco where she took up nurses' training. She was always an outstanding student and took an active part in all student body activities, having received an award in 1935 for maintaining a straight "A" grade throughout the year at the B. A. C. She was also a member of the Phi Alpha Beta social sorority at the local school.

Following her graduation from the nurses' training school on February 1, 1940, she was given the distinction of being chosen to work in the surgical department of the hospital in San Francisco, where she worked until her return to Cedar City last September for a few month's vacation with her family. Miss Jones returned to San Francisco on January 20th. of this year and has been employed in the nursery of the Mount Zion hospital since that time.
