

Open Home For Aged In Parowan

The home in Parowan, established by Iron County, for the old people of Iron county and surrounding areas is now in operation, and accommodating a number of aged residents of the county who have made arrangements to reside there.

It is expected that by the end of February the home will be filled to capacity, according to Samuel J. Whitney, operator. County Commissioner I. E. Riddle, who is responsible for the county's interest in the home announces, that residents of other county's will be admitted to the home upon application, but states that the needs of Iron county residents will be considered first in all cases.

The County purchased the Clark Orton home in Parowan last June at a cost of \$5000, and has been completely remodeled at considerable cost to the county. It has been equipped with all modern conveniences, and has been arranged to accommodate twenty-five inmates comfortably. The entire home has been redecorated, and considerable new furniture added including the required number of single beds with comfortable mattresses and plenty of blankets.

The kitchen has been equipped with an electric range, water heating and refrigeration units, and the dining room has been equipped with a number of small tables.

The people who live at the home pay their own expenses from money they receive from the Welfare department or from private funds, so that the county is reimbursed for the cost of operating the home.
