

# Legion Dedicates Plaque to Honor Veterans

A plaque containing the names of 335 young men who served with the armed forces of the United States during World War II from the communities of Parowan, Paragonah and Summit, was unveiled and dedicated at a special ceremony at the American Legion Memorial plot about noon on July 4th.

The plaque was placed on the memorial erected right after the First World War and which contains the names of World War I veterans. It was presented to the Parowan Legion post No. 20 by the American Legion auxiliary, with Anna T. Adams making the presentation, and Mrs. Arch Benson presiding at the ceremony.

The plaque was unveiled by Mrs. Sarah E. Bayles, oldest charter member of the Parowan auxiliary unit, and Mrs. A. C. Hatch, wife of Lt. Col. A. C. Hatch, veteran of both World Wars. The plaque was accepted in behalf of the Legion by post commander Chester S. Ward and it was dedicated by Parowan stake president, W. Clair Rowley, veteran of World War I.

Of the names on the plaque 250 of them are names of Parowan men, 58 are from Paragonah and 27 are from Summit. Gold stars, denoting the extreme sac-

rifice stand alongside the names of Otto Keith Dalley of Summit; Claude D. Adams, Lyle W. Robb and Dewey A. Topham, Paragonah, and Karl B. Bayles, Austin L. Halterman, Leonard E. Hulet, Earl D. Hyatt, Eugene Lowder, Jack W. Moore, Milo Mortensen, John Quenten Page, Brian Pendleton, Arthur Peterson and Mark J. Wilcock.
