Aerial search has been almost completely ineffective owing to weather conditions throughout the week, it was reported Tuesday by Douglas Knell, who was one of the Cedar City group contacted in connection with the search. Seven planes from Cedar City have been involved, but Tuesday, reported improvements in weather conditions had not developed sufficiently to allow for extensive search. Knell indicated that hellicopter units from Hill Air Force Base were also on a standby alert to assist once weather conditions sisted. were condusive.

In addition to Knell, Bob

Bradshaw, Jim Breeze and Bob Sigfrid of Color Country Aviation of Cedar City; John Cox, Bill Clark and Symon Bronson were assisting with seven planes. Also participating ear. lier was Dex Cowley, also of Cedar City.

Over the weekend a group of snowmobile owners were also participating but efforts Sunday and Monday had not produced any results. But again, extremely cold weather and deep snow has hampered that operation.

Efforts of the Jeep Patrol has been limited to travelable highways in the area and has also been limited.

Metherell and Trussell had filed a flight plan from Cedar City to Boise. They left Cedar City at approximately 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 7. Metherell is an experienced pilot and had maintained radio contact throughout the flight until contact was lost in the northern Nevada area.

Efforts are expected to continue with concentration in the Ruby Mountains, it was reported by the Forest Service who has assumed much of the leadership in the early stages of the search operations.
